The meeting was called to order at 6:00 p.m. in the Council Chambers, located in the City of Ukiah Civic Center, Ukiah, CA by Chair Janet Pauli.

Chair Pauli explained that anything not currently on the agenda may be discussed at this time, however no action could be taken. She further advised that comments would be welcome throughout the meeting.

Vivian Helliwell spoke regarding the PVP relicensing and Huffman's committee groups. Looking at the IWPC website she was surprised to read about widespread impacts to the Eel River from commercial fishing. Part of what the Pacific Coast Federation of Fishermen's Association is working on is to restore the fisheries in the Eel River. They have very conservative fishing regulations to protect the fish populations. Chinook is at 2% of what it used to be, but the cause is due to a multitude of reasons. Pauli asked Helliwell for more up-to-date information from the PCFFA and we will add it to the website. The PCFFA pay, through their taxes, for restoration and analysis by the government to keep track of the fish.

Tony Kaniea spoke as a fisherman on how far he needs to go outside of this area to find salmon anymore. He goes to Oregon to find large quantities of salmon. The industry is heavily regulated at this point.
